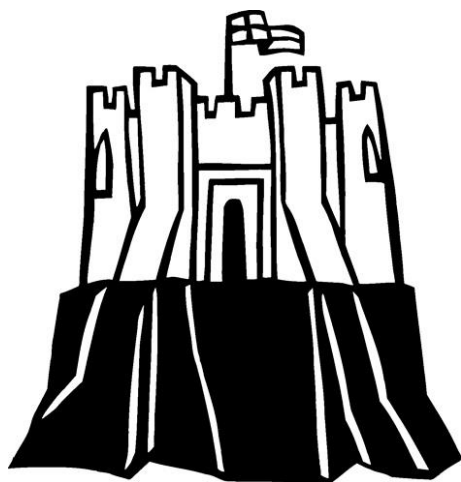

<sup>31</sup>The days are surely coming, says the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. <sup>32</sup>It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt—a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the LORD. <sup>33</sup>But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the LORD: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. <sup>34</sup>No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, "Know the LORD," for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the LORD; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

**Second Reading**

Romans 3:19-28

<sup>19</sup>Now we know that whatever the law says, it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. <sup>20</sup>For “no human being will be justified in his sight” by deeds prescribed by the law, for through the law comes the knowledge of sin.

<sup>21</sup>But now, apart from law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed, and is attested by the law and the prophets, <sup>22</sup>the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, <sup>23</sup>since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; <sup>24</sup>they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, <sup>25</sup>whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. He did this to show his righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over the sins previously committed; <sup>26</sup>it was to prove at the present time that he himself is righteous and that he justifies the one who has faith in Jesus.

<sup>27</sup>Then what becomes of boasting? It is excluded. By what law? By that of works? No, but by the law of faith. <sup>28</sup>For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law.

**Affirmation of Baptism - Confirmation**

*Confirmation marks the completion of a two-year period of instruction in the Bible, Christian faith, and Lutheran tradition. Those being confirmed were made members of the church through God's action in baptism, and today publicly confirm the faith into which they were baptized.*

The following persons have been instructed in the Christian faith and desire to make public affirmation of their baptism:

Friends in Christ, the good news that we have shared with you is that in Holy Baptism, God has already claimed you, given you the gift of the Holy Spirit, and received you as members of Christ's Church. Since your baptism, through your community of faith you have learned from God's Word about God's loving purpose for you and all creation. You have been fed at the Lord's table and called to be witnesses to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We rejoice that God has stirred up in you the desire to make public profession of your faith and assume greater responsibility as you live in our community and share God's mission.

As you affirm your baptism, I therefore ask you to reject sin, profess your faith in Christ, and confess the faith of the church.

Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?

Class: **I renounce them.**

Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?

Class: **I renounce them.**

Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?

Class: **I renounce them.**

Do you believe in God the Father?

**I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

**I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day rose again, he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father; and he will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

**I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**

You have made public profession of your faith. Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism:

to live among God's faithful people,

to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper,

to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,

to serve all people, following the example of Jesus,

and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

*Each Confirmand answers in turn:*

**I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.**

People of God, do you promise to support these young people and pray for them in their life in Christ?

**We do, and we ask God to help and guide us.**

*(The confirmands' parents, godparents, mentors, and teachers are invited to come forward to the altar rail, where the students will kneel.)*

Gabriel's reading: Psalm 150

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Stir up in Sierra/Gabriel/Julia the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever.
